Transparency International gives RUAG second-best rating

Transparency International, the global independent anti-corruption movement, has ranked RUAG in the second-best rank in its Defence Companies Index on Anti-Corruption and Corporate Transparency (DCI). RUAG has made significant improvements to increase its own transparency since the last survey in 2015 which now pay off.

With a score of 72 out of 108 possible points, RUAG was listed in rank B in the latest assessment of defense companies by Transparency International. The assessment provides a comprehensive overview of the quality and extent of publicly available anti-bribery and corruption policies and procedures in the areas that present the highest corruption risks to a company active in the defence sector.

After the last assessment in 2015 RUAG invested massively into its own compliance performance and clearly communicated its anti-corruption stance and safeguard. In the 10 categories assessed, RUAG improved particularly, and thus scored high, in the following three categories: Leadership and organizational culture, internal controls as well as state-owned enterprises.
